Description of the Cooperative Program:

#### **General Education**

The general education credits earned in the Associate in Applied Science Degree offered by **Lake Superior College** as approved by MNSCU will be recognized at Bemidji State University under the following two conditions:

1. A syllabus (course description and outline) of courses offered for general education credit at **Lake Superior College** must be submitted on a yearly basis to BSU for approval. The standard for approval shall be the ability to identify an equivalent course in the current BSU catalog having a similar course description and course learning objective for which general education credit is granted.
2. A current list of faculty teaching the courses to be recognized at **Lake Superior College** must be provided to the University Transfer Specialist on an annual basis. These persons must hold at least a master's degree in the discipline area in which the course is offered. Curriculum vitae for all faculty must be provided to the University.

Both of the above conditions must be fully satisfied for the course(s) to be recognized for full transfer.

#### **Industrial Technology, B.A. Degree**

Students receiving the Associate of Applied Science degree, a diploma, or a certificate in a technical specialty may receive a block of up to 16 semester credits of general electives provided that all Bemidji State University transfer policies as stated in the BSU catalog at the time of admission are fully satisfied. Students may also receive a maximum block of 26 semester credits from the technical specialty component in transfer satisfying the technical core of the Industrial Technology, B.A. program. The major department shall be responsible for validating any such coursework contained in the specialty area.



**All transfer consideration shall require that a letter grade of "C" or higher have been earned in coursework.**


Time Frame for Memorandum of Understanding:

The principles and practices contained in this cooperative agreement are subject to modification in accordance with changes in the policies of MNSCU or any subsequent board. In all such instances, students currently enrolled in a program of study at **Lake Superior College** shall be considered under the transfer policies contained in the Bemidji State University catalog at the time of admission. Applicants who have completed coursework, an Associate of Applied Science Degree or a diploma or certificate program who do not transfer directly into Bemidji State University shall be under the policies of the Bemidji State University catalog in place at the time of the application of admission.

This cooperative agreement shall be reviewed annually or as the need may arise by the Vice President for Academic and Student Affairs at Bemidji State University, or designee, and the Vice President for Instruction, or designee, at **Lake Superior College**. Any modifications to this cooperative agreement shall require a written notification of the intent to change or suspend the agreement and a meeting between the two parties.
