 Intra-Agency Agreement

Transfer Articulation Agreement: Women's Studies

This agreement is entered into between Metropolitan State University and Minneapolis Community and Technical College for the purpose of facilitating the transfer of credits from MCTC to Metro State for students desiring to earn a baccalaureate degree in Women's Studies.

Program Articulation:

The parties agree that the Women's Studies Certificate at MCTC partially fulfills the requirements of the bachelor of arts in Women's Studies at Metro State, as follows:

For students who complete the MCTC Women's Studies Certificate, all fifteen (15) credits applicable to the certificate will also be applicable to Metro State's 34-credit Bachelor of Arts in Women's Studies. To fulfill all requirements of this major, transfer students holding the MCTC certificate must complete Metro State's WmnS 401 Issues and Inquiries in Women's Studies; WmnS 470 Women's Studies Capstone; and at least 11 credits in core or liberal arts disciplinary electives specified by the program. The following chart indicates the applicability of MCTC courses to this major:

In addition to completing the requirements for the Women's Studies major, students seeking the baccalaureate degree will be required to complete Metro State's 40-credit general education requirement (waived for MCTC students with an associate of arts degree) and 8-credit upper-division liberal studies requirement, as well as Metro State's graduation requirement of 120 total semester credits, including at least 40 upper-division credits and 30 credits completed in residence at Metro State.

Note: this agreement applies only to students who complete the Women's Studies Certificate.

Duration of the Agreement:

This agreement becomes effective immediately and remains in effect until terminated by either party. It may be terminated or amended for succeeding academic years by either institution on or before June 30 of each year.

Persons Responsible and Evaluation of the Agreement:

The Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at Metropolitan State University and the Dean of Academic Affairs at Minneapolis Community and Technical College will be responsible for implementing this agreement and overseeing a regular evaluation of its outcomes.
