and Metropolitan State University  
Cooperative Agreement: Child Development/Psychology

Metropolitan State University and Minneapolis Community and Technical College are both committed to serving students in the twin cities metropolitan area. Metropolitan State University has been recognized as a higher education leader in working collaboratively with other higher educational institutions. Similarly, Minneapolis Community and Technical College has worked cooperatively with higher educational institutions to provide students enhanced educational opportunities. This memorandum of understanding is designed to build on these partnerships to further facilitate student access to higher education and specifically to articulate the Minneapolis Community and Technical College program in child development with Metropolitan State University's psychology major housed in the College of Professional Studies.

Joint Admission

Students may be jointly admitted to both institutions. With joint admissions, students are guaranteed a place in Metropolitan State University's psychology major upon transfer from Minneapolis Community and Technical College. Joint admissions also provide that students:

1. can concurrently enroll in courses at both institutions;
2. will have access to program advisors at both institutions;
3. will have other rights and privileges of students at both institutions; and
4. will be sent mailings from both institutions.

Transfer/Program Articulation

1. Only courses with grades of C- or better will transfer into Metropolitan State University. Transfer of lower division courses is limited to 84 semester credits (126 quarter credits).
2. Up to forty (40) semester credits (60 quarter credits) of general education courses will be accepted in transfer from Minneapolis Community and Technical College and can be used to meet Metropolitan State University's requirements for graduation.
3. Up to forty-two (42) semester credits (63 quarter credits), required for the Minneapolis Community and Technical College's Child Development program, can be used toward meeting the requirements of a Metropolitan State University bachelor of arts degree with a major in psychology.
4. Students may enroll in general education courses at Metropolitan State University while pursuing their studies at Minneapolis Community and Technical College, or they may also choose to transfer general education credits, offered by another regionally accredited post-secondary institution, to meet Metropolitan State University's general education requirements.

5. For graduation, students will need to complete, for the Bachelor of Arts in Psychology, a total of 120 semester credits, including at least 40 upper-division credits. A minimum of 30 semester credits must be completed while in residence at Metropolitan State University.
6. Students with an Associate in Arts degree from a MnSCU institution or students who have completed the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum do not have to complete any additional general education requirements, consistent with Appendix A.
7. Minneapolis Community and Technical College courses will be accepted toward meeting Metropolitan State University general education requirements consistent with Appendix A.
8. The courses required for the A.A.S. degree in child development at Minneapolis Community and Technical College and their relationship to Metropolitan State University requirements are listed in Appendix B.

Publicity

Each institution will include a jointly agreed upon description of this program in their respective catalogs and other printed materials.

Review and Modification of Agreement

This agreement shall be reviewed by the Dean of the College of Professional Studies at Metropolitan State University and the Dean, or designee, at Minneapolis Community and Technical College, on an annual basis or as the need may arise. Any modifications to this agreement will require written notification of the intent to change the agreement and the mutual agreement of the two parties.

Effective Date of Agreement

The agreement shall be effective on the date it is signed, and shall remain in effect unless terminated by either party upon one year's notice to the other party.
