Two-Plus-Two articulation agreements will be jointly developed by Hibbing Community College and UMD for degree programs at Hibbing Community College for which UMD has a Bachelor's degree program. Two-Plus-Two articulation agreements will consist of a schedule of courses for students to take during their two years at Hibbing Community College and the succeeding two years at UMD. This will result in the completion of a specific baccalaureate degree program in SFA. SFA and Hibbing Community College will work jointly on the development of these articulation agreements, completing them by **December 1, 1998**. Students participating in the program will need to follow the formal application procedure to UMD for advanced standing students, but will be guaranteed admission to the program if requirements are met.

Students participating in the program will be subject to UMD's high school preparation requirements, liberal education requirements, and all-UMD requirements for the granting of degrees.
