This transfer guide is designed to help a student at Riverland Community College easily and confidently choose courses to take at Riverland CC that will satisfy Bethel general education (core curriculum) requirements. Unless otherwise indicated, one (1) course from each area will satisfy that gen ed requirement. Pages 14-30 in the Bethel Catalog provides further information regarding Bethel's transfer and general education requirements. In most cases, with careful planning you will be able to fulfill Riverland CC curriculum objectives, while also completing coursework that Bethel requires. Contact Bethel or Riverland CC to assistance with your planning.

Here are some additional guidelines to consider:

- Most courses required for a specific academic major should be taken at Bethel.
- Any Riverland CC course taken to satisfy a requirement for a major at Bethel should be approved by the specific academic department at Bethel.
- Bethel's programs are designed to be completed in 4 years. Early communication with you will allow Bethel to help you to determine when it is best for you to transfer.
- Courses that are listed under more than one category can only count once. Students can choose which category they prefer.
- A grade of 'C' or higher is required on each course to be accepted by Bethel.
